

Building Momentum for Affordable Housing

Last month, we welcomed U.S. Senator Tina Smith to Summer Meadows, Alexandria's first affordable housing development since 2002. Senator Smith saw firsthand how collaboration and community partnerships are helping families achieve the dream of homeownership.

During her visit, she toured the neighborhood and spoke with Habitat homeowners and homebuyers, who shared how homeownership was only possible for them because of Habitat's programs and the various funding sources accessible through the program.

Our Habitat construction team showcased the building process, with special attention to the extra steps we take to ensure energy-efficient homes that lower costs and create long-term stability for homeowners.

Senator Smith, a strong advocate for affordable housing and lead author of the bipartisan ROAD to Housing Act of 2025, spoke about the nation's housing crisis and why programs like Habitat's are critical in reversing troubling trends. Her support underscores how important it is for leaders and communities to work together to increase affordability, expand supply, and create accountability in housing.

The Summer Meadows development has captured attention from Habitat affiliates across Minnesota and beyond. Our team has been invited to share about the project and the partnerships that made it possible. Over the next eight to ten years, Summer Meadows will grow into a vibrant neighborhood of 42 single-family affordable homes—each one a step toward a stronger, more hopeful future.

Representatives from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development, Alexandria Mayor Bobbie Osterberg, Alexandria City Council, and Nicole Fernholz from the Alexandria Area Economic Development Commission also joined to highlight the vital role local and federal partnerships play in making projects like Summer Meadows possible.

Thank you to Senator Smith, our community partners, and every volunteer and donor who make this work possible.

Together, we are building more than homes—we are building a better future for local families and our community.






Celebrating our Team

Donor Advised Funds 101

A donor-advised fund (DAF) is a tax-advantaged account that makes charitable giving easier and more impactful. Think of it like a 401(k) for philanthropy—it allows you to contribute funds, receive an immediate tax benefit, and recommend grants to charities over time.

Anyone—individuals, families, or companies—can open a DAF through a provider. These accounts have become increasingly popular because they help maximize giving potential while simplifying the giving process.

Last year, 548 volunteers spent 5,907 hours on our build sites, an average of 134 volunteers with 1,436 hours per house!
