No matter one's age, having a decent place to call home — a place to feel secure — can lead to future success. The need for affordable housing is immense, and **the lasting impact it can have on homeowners and their families is undeniable.**



The Impact of Affordable Housing



Habitat for Humanity knows that stable housing — housing that is safe, decent and affordable — is foundational to individuals, families, to the communities in which we live and to the economies in which we all participate. Affordable homeownership helps create the conditions that free families from instability, stress and fear, and encourages self-reliance and confidence in nearly every aspect of their lives.

Habitat works with families to help them acquire the access, skills and financial education necessary for them to be successful homeowners. **Through shelter, we empower.**

In 2015, Wilder Research completed a study of Habitat homeowners to understand the impact of our work. Of Habitat homeowners who were surveyed:

- · 64% say their kids' grades have improved
- 40% go to the doctor less now
- 92% have an adult family member who has or plans to return to school
- 90% feel better about their children's futures
- 92% said their lives were better
- 89% feel better about themselves than before becoming a Habitat homeowner

Habitat Douglas County has witnessed the same tangible evidence that decent, affordable shelter creates long-lasting and **life-changing impact** on families and communities.

Congratulations DECA students! 1st Place at State DECA competition and moving to Internationals

Volunteering on a build last summer led three Alexandria DECA students to a much bigger impact than any of us could have imagined. Ben Borden, Lilly Thull, and Erik Hedstrom expressed interest in partnering with Habitat on their DECA community project. This partnership allowed Habitat to be awarded a \$20,000 matching grant from State Farm, one of four in the nation.

We were honored to work alongside them and were amazed at their energy, enthusiasm and bursting hearts for setting God's love into action to build homes, community and hope. Thank you to Ben, Lilly, & Erik for your hard work, determination and servant hearts.

"Ben, Lilly and I were lucky to partner with Habitat for Humanity and State Farm for our DECA project. We had the opportunity to receive real-world business experience while also giving back to our community. In our efforts to

"The partnership with Thrivent has had a monumental impact on our organization," states Lori Anderson, Executive Director. "Beyond the significant financial investment, Thrivent Faith Builds has helped us to develop organizational capacity. Through the partnership, we developed a construction calendar, deepened our relationship with the faith community, and improved our planning process and systems. Our mission and our community are stronger because of Thrivent's investment in affordable housing."

To celebrate this partnership, Lori spoke with Larry Gebhardt, Community Engagement Leader and Mike Loken, Thrivent Builds Affiliate Project Leader.

What impact have you seen through this partnership?

Larry: In the beginning, the program was a bit clunky and many affiliates were struggling. It's amazing to see the progress! The number of homes built through this partnership is incredible.

Mike: The partnership seemed to come together at the perfect time, when many affiliates (including ours) knew they needed more structure to be able to build more than one home per year. This program provided that structure and helped Habitat accomplish that goal! There's a great deal of trust that has been established and maintained throughout the years.

What is a highlight of this partnership?

Mike: Millard Fuller, the founder of Habitat, spoke at our 2007 Hard Hat Breakfast. Hearing directly from him and spending time together was inspirational! Additionally, I remember all the planning meetings and reporting requirements. While they may not have been highlights at the time, they really helped our affiliate become more structured, organized and productive. I'm proud of the partnership between Thrivent and Habitat and of the success of our affiliate.

Larry: The highlight is two-fold; first, the affiliates would not have been able to grow and build homes so, second, the number of safe, affordable homes built in this community would not have happened without this partnership.
