There is real return when people invest in a community. For every dollar invested in Habitat, \$1.54 is invested in the local economy through our work. That investment impacts not only people today, but generations of change for the future.

For homeowner Jenna, the journey to homeownership was all about family. Her family, the family of volunteers helping build her home, the family that developed from the partnership with her mentors, Greta and Joel Siegel, and the feeling of family that surrounded her throughout the process. "My children are my world. I want them to know they are loved, important, that I will always be their biggest supporter, loudest fan, and do everything I can to give them the life they deserve."

Jenna has worked very hard to achieve her dream of owning a home. Though her first application was denied, Jenna did not give up hope. "After working on a few things, I applied the second time and was accepted into the program." Her determination continued throughout the build process as she completed more than the 200 hours of required sweat equity, including visiting the build site as much as she could during her lunch break and after school. "When you want something, you set a goal and figure out how to make it work."

Through her role on the Homeowner Selection Committee, Greta met Jenna while participating in the home visit, one of the steps of the application process. She felt a connection to Jenna right away and volunteered to be her mentor if she was approved. During the process, both families really bonded together. "I don't know if our paths would have crossed if not for this experience, but I can't imagine my life without her. I've seen first-hand how hard she fights for her kids, how the events of her life have shaped her into the determined and dedicated mom she is, and how much respect her kids give her." Both Jenna and Greta's families continue to get together for pizza, games, and fun.

Since closing on her home this spring, Jenna now feels grateful, blessed and happy. "I feel fulfilled, cared-for, nurtured and want to give back, just like everyone has done for me. I had so much community support. From the bottom of my heart, thank you to everyone for their time, efforts, and financial support to help provide a home for a family like mine. Our home is a place of safety, family, and a place to grow."

## Thank you for opening doors at the Hard Hat Events!



Pictures above and right are from the June 15, 2022 Hard Hat Events.

Over 600 people gathered at the Hard Hat events on Wednesday, June 15, 2022 to celebrate 25 years in Douglas County. The event showcased how the lives of 134 families have been transformed through affordable homeownership and repairs, impacting lives for many generations.

Habitat co-founders Dave Anderson and Bob Loucks reflected on how the affiliate got started. After many years and thousands of hours creating policies, procedures, prayer and planning, the affiliate was finally approved by Habitat for Humanity International on January 31, 1997. Despite the length of time it took to get organized, people often eagerly asked, "Can we pound nails yet?"

"I am proud to say I am a Habitat homeowner!" shared speaker Jenna, who closed on her home this spring. "My children are the reason I applied to Habitat. I want them to have a place for them to call home, a place they are proud to invite their friends to, a place they are safe."

Greta Siegel, member of the Homeowner Selection Committee and mentor with her husband, Joel, complimented Jenna's efforts throughout the process. "I've seen how hard she has worked to build a solid, stable life for her children."

Nicole Fernholz, Executive Director for the Alexandria Area Economic Development Commission, stated: "The average annual income of Douglas County residents is \$53,000, which is not enough to afford a median income value home in Douglas County of \$229,511 and keep the monthly payment within 30%." The 30% rule is based on the industry standard for how much a family can reasonably spend monthly on housing and still have money left to afford everyday expenses like food and transportation.

### **Anniversary Builds**

June 16, 2022, was another milestone day for our affiliate as we began construction on both of our Anniversary Build homes simultaneously. Located side-by-side, we've even had a few days when groups have built on both homes on the same day. All the walls are built, trusses have been set, windows and doors installed, siding is on and sheetrock is hung. Once the interior of the Faith Build home is complete, we'll return to these sites to finish all the interior work. We've already welcomed 154 volunteers who've shared 627 hours on these homes and the homes are not quite halfway complete.

Construction on our Faith Build home began on April 18, 2022. Despite the cold day and snow, the hearts of our volunteers were warm as they rallied to tip up walls for Brenda's family. Since starting, 162 volunteers have given 1,405 volunteer hours to help build this home. All the walls are complete, siding is on, interior painting has been done and the kitchen/bathrooms are ready for cabinets to be installed. We'll soon be back on site to complete the rest of the interior work including trim, accessories, appliances, and the final
